E-Bulletin: 4th Line Theatre Announces Shuttle Service August 12th – 16th

4th Line Theatre has announced a special shuttle service for patrons of *Schoolhouse* for the **week of August 12th to 16th**. Due to heavy rains in the area, the regular parking area used by the theatre has been rendered unusable, and to ensure the safety and comfort of the theatre audience the decision to offer this service was made yesterday by the executive staff at 4th Line Theatre.

This **complimentary** shuttle service will be provided courtesy of First Student Canada Bus Services, and will bring patrons from the parking area at the Old Millbrook School directly to the Winslow Farm on Zion Line where the theatre holds their summer plays. Beginning at 3:45pm each, patrons are requested to take advantage of this free service, which runs until 5:30pm. The shuttle will return patrons to the parking lot after the show.

Patrons unfamiliar with the historic Old Millbrook School (1 Dufferin St.) can use two approaches:

From County Rd. 28:

Take the “Millbrook turnoff” west at County Rd. 21. Look for County Rd. 10 (going South) but take the next left, which is Gravel Road. Take an immediate right and park in front of the school located to your left.

From Hwy 401/115:

Take the Millbrook exit at County Rd. 10 going South. Once in the village of Millbrook, take a left at the Stop sign (County Rd. 21) and then take the first right at Gravel Road. Take an immediate right and park in front of the school located to your left.
