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### KIM BLACKWELL, MANAGING ARTISTIC DIRECTOR | ROBERT WINSLOW, CREATIVE DIRECTOR

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I AM THRILLED to welcome you back to the Farm for our Anniversary Season. Who could have known in 2019, it would be three years until I would write one of these letters again. And who could have known in 1992 that we would be gathering here today 30 years later!

As I write this, I am sitting in my favourite perch in the green bleachers. Rehearsals are happening all around me. It is wonderful to once again watch actors creating characters in this space. I am always struck by the beauty of Robert Winslow's 170-year-old family farm. I love this place and everything that it represents.





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### A MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGING ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

We celebrate the 30th Anniversary at 4th Line by both looking back to where we have come from and forward to where we are going. I am grateful to Robert for having the idea for 4th Line, for writing and directing many of those early shows and for his vision and commitment to local stories and community. The very first show he wrote for the farm, The Cavan Blazers, set the bar high. We have never shied away from the difficult stories, the ones perhaps some would like forgotten.

From beginning, to this day, none of this could have happened without incredible people. There have been, literally, thousands of people who

have been a part of the creation and growth of this magical place. From the Founders (Robert, Jerome Ackhurst, P.J. Thomas and Frances Wintjes) to the countless actors, designers and technicians and members of the local community So many have given their time and energy to make this theatre a reality. 4th Line Theatre is the sum total of each and every person who has walked these fields in pursuit of great art. And to our audience members, without you there would be no art here. Thank you to everyone.

The 'heroes' of 4th Line Theatre are the people who have shared their stories with us. Scores of people have opened their hearts and minds and said, "Come on in and look around, see if anything would be of use to you." Without the generosity of folks, sharing pieces of themselves, the stories simply would not have been there to create the plays. These people's lives have become part of local lore and indeed the psyche of this country.

Most of our plays explore the extraordinary inside the ordinary lives of regular people. That makes me think of the first settlers who came to this very place. Robert's ancestors arrived from Ireland into the wilds of this land. I think of Robert's grandparents and parents who brought this land back into his family. And it makes me think of



Robert and all that he has given and sacrificed for this place. I know he has realized innumerable gifts from this theatre over the last 30 years. And he has carried an extraordinary load for all of us. For three decades Robert has allowed all of us into his backvard (sometimes more than 17,000 people in a summer). On behalf of all of us who love this theatre, Robert deserves to celebrate this year. This is his place, it has been in his family for 170 years. He knew in 1992, that there was something deeply special in the land and he invited all of us to come and experience it. What an amazing gift. Happy Anniversary to all of us, especially Robert.

As I look ahead to the next 20 or even 30 years, I am thinking of the countless untold stories still to explore. Most especially we are committed to continue to find the little known stories of the first peoples of Canada; the unknown stories of the immigrants to this place; and we will continue to ruminate on injustice in all its many forms.

The Great Shadow comes by its title honestly. It all starts with our brave Canadian producer George Brownridge's dream. The film studio is built and the production titled "The Great Shadow" is scheduled to take place. Hollywood A list comes to town and throws its great shadow on a nascent Canadian film industry. Two great gossip columnists (the original Twitter?) Hedda Hopper and Louella Parsons continue to try and overshadow each other on the Canadian soil, while the giant shadow of the Hollywood mogul Adolph Zukor falls on Hollywood North East. Meanwhile, the shadow of the Great Winnipeg strike looms large in the background of "The Great Shadow" the movie, while the enormous shadows of Lenin and Stalin are cast as far as Trenton.

"I ought to be in pictures!" thinks a young girl from Trenton with a healthy dose of sass and pizzazz and she becomes the unlikely star of The Great Shadow. The tiny star's performance ends up overshadowing that of Tyrone Powell Sr. Then another, different kind of shadow in this story is cast by Shane, a fallen soldier from the Great War. Shane's unfailing, dependable and most constant shadow is invisible to everyone but his widow. Shane's too gives Hollywood a run for its money...

This is my third time at the 4th Line. I truly love this beautiful theatre and its artists but also its unbelievably wonderful, sophisticated and loyal audience with whom I am excited to share this expansive, panoramic, heartwarming yet bittersweet story about telling Canadian stories. Collectively we came up with guiding images for our show and here are some of them: An old projector... A moving train that connects dreamland with real life, heated politics with pain of progress, haves with have nots. As our train moves along from place to place it attracts more and more moths to its irresistible flame of fame. And even those who try to resists it do end up burned by the alluring sparkle of the movie magic. A tale of ambition, change, cultural identity, bravery and vision... A zany, charming, colourful, expressive, dynamic and hopeful uphill battle... An vintage car sharp, precise and fun! A mad dash... A whirwind... A gut punch....

The playwright asks his audience a "meta question": when was the last time you were in the theatre and when was the last time you watched something upon a screen? For some of us it may have been a while, eh? Well, here we all are tonight: in person, live, about to experience the magic of performing art once again while at the same time celebrating 4th Line's 30th anniversary.

So fasten your seat belts because the road to Trenton's film studio hasn't been paved... and The Great Shadow is yet to be filmed... Lights, camera, action!

### PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTES

WHEN DIRECTOR KIM BLACKWELL AND I went out in a boat on Rice Lake one warm summer day, it hit me what a varied and interesting job a playwright can have. Kim had introduced me to Janet Kellough's novel, Wishful Seeing almost five years ago, and I was captivated. Kim asked me to develop the story as a play, Janet graciously agreed to allow her book to be adapted, and I embraced the opportunity. But I had much to learn about the story's background. During my research and early development, I attended a Methodist church in Muskoka and was showered with books and stories by the local minister, who was delighted to hear that the play would be centred on the life and adventures of a Methodist preacher. I read the autobiography of Thaddeus Lewis, a man who lived through war and personal calamity that tested his faith, and I studied the area of Hamilton Township, to imagine Thaddeus's horseback journeys from village to village to bring God's Word. What I love about writing for 4th Line Theatre is the chance to dive into the history of the surrounding area, and imagine life as it was. And it was on Rice Lake in that boat with Kim, searching for Spook Island (the scene of the "crime") that I felt so blessed to not only have the chance to write a play again for the 4th Line audiences, but to gain such knowledge of the people, the events, and the landscape of this history-rich region.

### DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I LOVE A GOOD MURDER MYSTERY. Full stop.

When I read Janet Kellough's novel Wishful Seeing in the late summer of 2016. I found it to be a compelling story of greed, small town gossip, lies and the resulting murder. And I was captivated by the fictional character of Thaddeus Lewis, a saddlebag preacher and amateur detective.

There was a real life Thaddeus Lewis who was born in 1793 in Camden East, Upper Canada (Ontario), where his parents had settled after immigrating to Canada in 1783. Eventually, Thaddeus became a minister of the Methodist Episcopal Church. In the novel and the play, Lewis is struggling with his faith and relationship with his God.

Thrown into the mix is the intriguing story of the race to build the Cobourg to Peterborough railway line, which included the construction of a trestle bridge south to north over Rice Lake. Look that one up sometime!

And there you have it, a story of a community with big dreams and a belief in the ways in which technology will change their lives forever. The play explores the closed nature of small towns and how outsiders are received. All combined the play which Maja Ardal wrote, based on Janet's novel, is a rip-roaring tale of deception, fear, love and faith.

### HOW OUR PLAYS ARE DEVELOPED

4TH LINE IMPLEMENTS a five-phase New Play Development Program that supports the research, creation and workshopping of projects destined for production. Often works are in development for three years before they are presented on the Winslow Farm stage.

### PHASE 1: Seeding

Through a biennial new play competition, themes and ideas for plays are submitted. Successful playwrights receive "seed" funding to begin work with community members through reminiscences, soundings and/or interviews.

### PHASE 2: Breaking Ground

4th Line's seeded writers further develop their work through a workshop with a director and actors for Breaking Ground where the public is invited to hear the work.

### **PHASE 3: Commissions**

Once a playwright completes Breaking Ground, the project is considered for commissioning to create a first draft.

**PHASE 4: Intensive Development and Production Workshops** First drafts selected for presentation are further developed in workshops.

### PHASE 5: First Look (biennial)

Workshopped scripts are given a public reading as part of 4th Line's summer season.

New play development is critical to the success of 4th Line Theatre. The main aim of this program is to match professional playwrights to our theatre's particular aesthetic, thereby providing Canadian artists with a challenging, supportive and exciting creative experience, and in the process promoting regional cultural development and the creation of high-quality scripts for our audience.

**Scoop** by Herbie Barnes. This play will examine the 60s scoop of Indigenous children from their families and placement in adoptive situations with white families across Canada.

*The Intruder* by Maja Ardal A work about the mysterious death of Major Michelle Knight Mendes in Kandahar and the subject of women in the military.

Jim Watts: Girl Reporter by Beverley Cooper - based on the experience of Canadians who fought in the MacKenzie-Papineau battalion. Have received a first draft and held extensive dramaturgical sessions with Bev. There is a local connection in the piece to a man named Jim Higgins who fought in the Spanish Civil War and then settled in Peterborough. His memoir was recently released.

## SEEDING PLAYS

4TH LINE THEATRE, Canada's premiere outdoor theatre company, has made its mark on Canada's theatre industry as a producer, promoter and cultivator of new work with relevant local themes for 29 seasons. "We are thrilled that so many of Canada's

best playwrights have been seeded as a part of our New Play Development program," says Managing Artistic Director Kim Blackwell. "Our goal is to strategically invest in ideas, stories and artists who are developing innovative and transformative theatre."

## **NEW PLAY COMPETITION**

LINE

Held every two years, 4th Line Theatre's new play competition is open for play ideas from professional playwrights. Previous winners include Sky Gilbert's St. Francis of Millbrook, Judith Thompson's Who Killed Snow White?, Maja Ardal's The Hero of Hunter Street and Beverley Cooper's Jim Watts: Girl Reporter.

## **IN DEVELOPMENT**

*The Tilco Strike*, by D'Arcy Jenish recounts the year-long fight between 50 poorly paid women, and their hard-nosed male bosses at Tilco Plastics in Peterborough, who were determined to crush the women and their union. The strike began in December 1965 over a \$25 bonus and escalated into an epic battle between organized labour and strike-breaking employers. The women lost their fight, but changed labour relations in Ontario forever.

The World of Pearl Hart, by Maja Ardal. Born in Lindsay Ontario in 1871 Pearl Hart was the first woman tried and convicted of stagecoach robbery in the U.S. Pearl's journey takes her from small town Ontario through Chicago's World's Fair, Buffalo Bill's Wild West shows and the rough mining frontiers of Arizona. Her trial, imprisonment and wild escapades (often disguised as a boy) made her a notorious celebrity of the times.

*Eleanor*, by Ian McLachlan and Robert Winslow will be the fourth play in the Barnardo Children series of plays. It follows Walter White as a man in his early 60s and the woman, Eleanor, who comes to live with him on the farm and acts as a housekeeper for him.

These women, known as Farmerettes, planted, hoed and hand-weeded fruit and vegetable crops for long hours. It was part of a provincial program to replace male labour in the agricultural sector.

The Robinson Project [working title] by Megan Murphy will explore the Peter Robinson migration from Ireland to this area.

**Courage** A new play by Robert about a Jewish uprising during WWII.

*The Souls* by Kim Blackwell The play explores the 'lives' of the people who are buried at the Zion Line Cemetery. The piece will follow several inhabitants, as they exist in an afterlife of sorts.
