A Letter From Our Chair of the Board

had the pleasure to lead 4th Line Theatre for another year. 2022/2023 was a year which saw the theatre reemerge from the pandemic closures. And we were finally able to celebrate our 30th anniversary season. To celebrate our 30th season, we launched our first ever endowment campaign, 30 to the Future. We raised \$50,000 from our generous donors and because of their generosity, we are building a legacy of stable funding to ensure the theatre's future.

I am proud we made it through the pandemic, stronger than ever. I have been impressed by the hard work of our Board members and by the administrative staff. We undertook a strategic planning process with the entire Board of Directors and senior staff in September of 2022. We now have a new three-year strategic road map for the theatre. And we listened to our audience, who loud and clear told us they wanted new chairs. We bought 400 new and sturdy seats for the barnyard theatre. We continue to fundraise for the cost of the chairs through our Chair-ity Campaign led by businessman and arts enthusiast Brian Field.

We have strengthened many of our organizational policies this past year. And we bought our very first property which now acts as our administrative and box office centre in downtown Millbrook at 9 Tupper Street. The staff and artists have lead this organization with heart and vision. It has been wonderful to watch. This organization has become a regional and a national leader in terms of successful arts organizations. Everyone brings so much focus, patience, good humour and a desire to succeed in everything they do here. A big thank you to my fellow board members - Lisa, Ally, Dick, Robert, Kim, Anne, Andrew, Brian, Cody and Dane.

I want to recognize Lisa Dixon, who is stepping down from the Board of Directors at the Annual General Meeting. Lisa has been an active member of the Board of Directors since 2014 and Vice Chair of the Board for eight years. During Lisa's tenure, she chaired the 25th anniversary committee, and sat on many important ad hoc committees of the board. Her wisdom, and willingness to roll-up her sleeves, made an indelible mark on the theatre. Everyone will miss her. I want to thank her for everything she has done.

A Letter From Our Artistic Director

we gather again this year at our Annual General Meeting to look back on the fiscal year we completed on March 31, 2023. 2022/2023 saw a return to normal at 4th Line Theatre, including the return to a traditional summer season. We celebrated our 30th

anniversary during the summer of 2022. We were thrilled to have co-chairs Cody McMahon and Ally Pyle helm our 30th celebrations. Megan Murphy joined us as Associate Artistic Director to coordinate all 30th events, including a four-episode podcast series.

There was much to celebrate in 2022 and early 2023 and at the same time some of the challenges presented by the pandemic continue. We also continue to struggle with inflation and rising staffing costs. We followed the provincial health guidelines going into summer 2022 and discontinued mandatory masking, testing and proof of vaccinations at the theatre for both staff and audiences.

We produced two world premiere plays in 2022 - Alex Poch-Goldin's The Great Shadow and Maja Ardal's Wishful Seeing. Audiences came in large number to both shows. And while we fell 20% short of reaching our single ticket goal, we welcomed back thousands of audience members to the farm. We held a sold-out gala opening night for *The Great Shadow* with pre-show dinner and silent auction.

We once again formed and ran our Young Company, the third season in a row. We brought in more than 20 young people and five guest directors, under the leadership pf Young Company Producer Rebecca Birrell. We created six long-term multi-disciplinary residencies for regional artists.

We launched our first endowment campaign - 30 to the Future and successfully raised \$50,000, which is now invested in partnership with the Community Foundation of Greater Peterborough.

We held our third Barnyard Sessions, produced by Kate Suhr. Over 16 musicians joined us in the barnyard in late September 2022 for these magical music nights under the stars.

Our Board of Directors and Senior Staff gathered in September 2022 and developed a new three-year Strategic Plan.

We returned to almost normal operations with two reminiscences in 2022/2023 - in November 2022 we held a reminiscence for the first time since February 2020. The event invited people to gather in Ennismore, ON to share stories related to Megan Murphy's play Wild Irish Geese and the Peter Robinson immigration. Over 60 community members attended this reminiscence.

In February 2023, we gathered in Toronto to workshop Beverley Cooper's Jim Watts: Girl Reporter. We were joined by eight professional actors. This was the first workshop of a new play since 2020.

In May of 2022, the theatre bought it first administrative building at 9 Tupper Street. This new building allowed us to triple our administrative space, while bringing our summer costume building space in-house and billeting two summer staff members. We now have a stable administrative home in Millbrook. We are grateful to longtime landlord Paul Tinney for the years he supported us at his property, at 4 Tupper Street.

We began negotiations on a new 10-year lease for the farm property and have successfully completed those negotiations. And we bought 400 new chairs for the barnyard space. We ran our Chair-ity naming campaign and so far have raised over \$20,000 to cover the cost of the chairs. Thank you to Brian Field who chaired the campaign.

This past year continues to see a world with much instability. From the war in Ukraine to the ideological divisions here in Canada and indeed the world over, we live in uncertainty. I think the strength and leadership 4th Line has shown over the past year can bring some calm to people's lives. There must be moments of joy to remind us that life is here to live to its fullest.

There were many people who assisted throughout the year, most especially the extraordinary administrative team of Lindy Finlan, Sarah De Vouge, Annette Nadeau, and new employees Timmi Brady and Emma Hale. They worked diligently to deliver a year of unique and wonderful artistic work. They are amazing! The Board of Directors as well, went above and beyond, time and again. They offered guidance and support and rolled up their sleeves and were there whenever they were called upon by the administration team. A special thank you to Lisa Dixon, who is departing the Board of Directs after more than 10 years of extraordinary service.

We have 13 plays in development and a tentative schedule of plays into 2029. I believe 4th Line is ideally placed and ready to work with artists and communities to look back to where we have come from; look around and reflect on where we are presently; and look ahead and lead the way forward to a world with more compassion, hope and understanding.

Set in the roaring 20s, the stars of the silver screen are heading to Canada as Trenton, Ontario embarks on a quest to become Hollywood North. Sparks fly in this world premiere, when small-town Ontario residents collide with the Hollywood elites. From Alex Poch-Goldin, the playwright who brought you *The Right Road to Pontypool* and *The Bad Luck* Bank Robbers, The Great Shadow is a raucous comedy, packed with romance and intrigue in the golden age of film.

The play featured a sundry cast of characters including: well-known Hollywood actors; local Trentonians; gossip columnists Hedda Hopper and Louella Parsons; and international political figures of the time.

Impact

It was great to be back with a full summer season in 2022! As part of our mandate, we support local charities and this year we donated proceeds from ticket sales to Hospice Peterborough and provided over 150 free tickets to the Peterborough New Canadian Centre to distribute to new Canadians.

Bringing over 12,500 people to our region, the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport's TREIM Economic Impact Report measured 4th Line's 2022 season as having an economic impact of **\$2,050,412** in Ontario.

DOUBLE YOUR IMPACT CAMPAIGN




